



WHAT

About the Program

The Mentorship Program focuses on supporting the settlement and integration of newcomer immigrant and refugee youth entering grades 7-12 throughout the school year in the summer. The program provides information, resources, and support to facilitate positive transitions for youth into Canadian schools and communities. A unique aspect of the program involves the participation of Peer Mentors, youth who were once newcomers themselves, who provide 1:1 support for incoming newcomer youth during programming and community connections activities.



WHO

The program serves newcomer immigrant and refugee youth who are Permanent Residents, but not yet Canadian citizens. Summer programs are open to youth throughout the city of Calgary, and school year programs are open to youth at designated high schools.
