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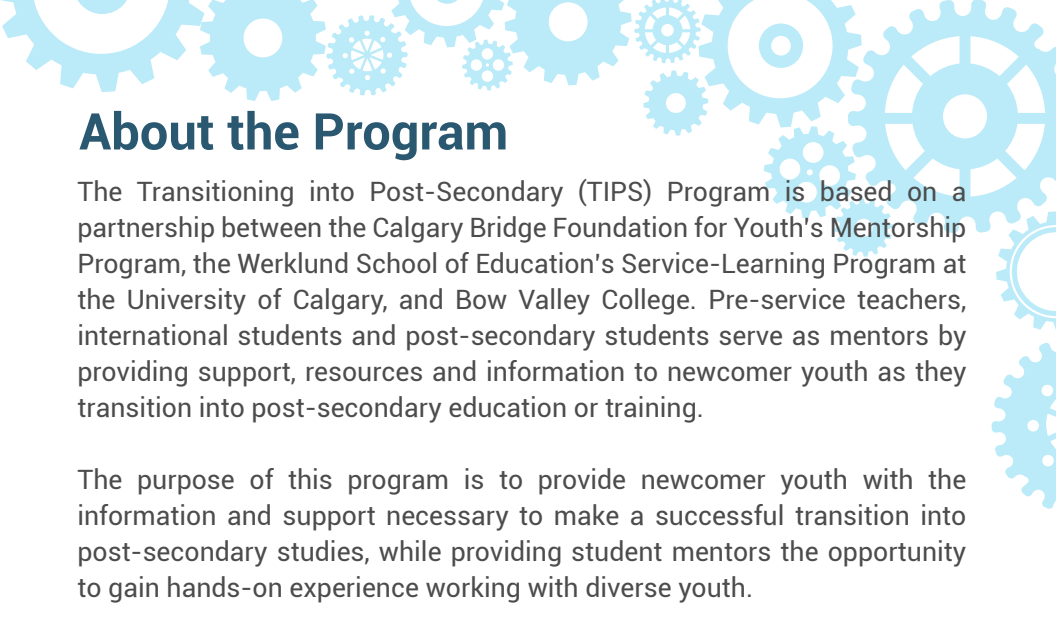

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About the Program

The Transitioning into Post-Secondary (TIPS) Program is based on a partnership between the Calgary Bridge Foundation for Youth's Mentorship Program, the Werklund School of Education's Service-Learning Program at the University of Calgary, and Bow Valley College. Pre-service teachers, international students and post-secondary students serve as mentors by providing support, resources and information to newcomer youth as they transition into post-secondary education or training.

The purpose of this program is to provide newcomer youth with the information and support necessary to make a successful transition into post-secondary studies, while providing student mentors the opportunity to gain hands-on experience working with diverse youth.

TIPS Program Components

WHO

- Each match is comprised of 1 post-secondary student mentor and 1 or 2 newcomer youth

WHAT

- U of C or BVC student mentors provide newcomer youth mentees with support, information and resources to assist in their transition to post-secondary education or training

WHERE

- Convenient library locations
- U of C campus
- Other Calgary post-secondary institutions

WHEN

- 2 orientation sessions
- 8-10 week meeting period, once a week for 1.5 hours (Fall, Winter & Spring)
- 2 group activities
- 1 closure session
